

In a country that is moving at breakneck speed toward a completely secular and material focus how do Christians faithfully live for Christ? In The Benedict Option, author Rod Dreher lays out a possible path for believers living in a post-From Christian society. Essentially Dreher contends that we are the Pastors Desk supersaturated with a humanistic worldview that is corrosive to faith and that if the church is to survive and thrive we must return to tried and true strategies. We all understand that for the first 3 centuries of the life of the Church, believers lived in a hostile Roman culture, many living in catacombs during the seasons of severest persecution. Fortunately we don't live in such a situation in our country yet, BUT another, and equally destructive force threatens. We run the risk of not acting or looking much different than the world because of our pluralistic values. The frog in the kettle so to speak. Dreher tells us that Saint Benedict started monastic communities to pull away from the "world". In these communities believers focus on prayer, work and Christian disciplines such as fasting and meditation. But heading for the hills is not really an option for most of us, is it? So Dreher encourages believers to form strong communities of faith in church--with Christian schools educating our children, thus enabling us to retain our distinctives of faith. I am all for strong churches, and faithful discipleship and have been myself the product of a Christian education. But let us not have a bunker mentality in the world. Jesus said we are to be in the world but not of it. And what has he called us to do? To live with a mission! To be ambassadors of Christ. Yes we are exiles in a hostile land. We are now living as the "underground" in a land of enemy occupation. Let us be salt and light--for how will the lost know unless they have heard? How beautiful are the feet of those bringing GoodNews--that our God reigns!

Session Highlights

Pastor Edward, Phil and Pat Inglis, and Wally Cook plan to attend the next presbytery meeting in May at Cedar Springs Presbyterian in Knoxville, TN.

The movie "Shack" was well attended by approximately 30 from the congregation. The discussion afterwards added to the value of the experience. Other community events would be considered in the future that would facilitate fellowship.

Many other ideas were suggested and discussed in addition to these. Pastor Edward asked that there be a few elders to help with drawing up a vision document for PC for the next 10 years.

Mission News



March Update

Spring is finally getting here. We are continually adjusting to the changing landscape here with the refugees. We will be having a meal this week with a 20-year old man from Syria who is an atheist from an M. background. He was referred to us by the local director of refugees here as a young man who was nearing a depression (as a lot of the young single men are at risk) because he was working hard in school and seeing little future/results from being in Germany. There is definitely an opening to communicate His true love to him, especially since his German is good enough to dialogue effectively.



Another family we met from Afghanistan were forced to flee from the Taliban with their three sons, during the long journey, they got separated at a border crossing and their 15 year-old son was taken from them, beaten and questioned, then returned to Afghanistan...they have not seen him for over a year and do not know when/if that will happen. These are not atypical stories here...thank you all for being such a key part of Engaging the Displaced among refugees in Germany! We are seeing His hand at work in lives here amidst many challenges.

- we continue be blessed with new refugee relationships (that's a prayer and praise)
- just over \$1,000/month in support needs

Samuel and Ian seem to be doing fine...other than missing friends, Chipotle and Chick-fil-A.... Samuel, to his heart's delight, is now practicing lacrosse with the local university team, at 14, he is definitely the smallest on the field. (He has already been invited to a lacrosse party with "pizza, lacrosse videos, and lots of beer..." an invitation which was vetoed unanimously by his parents).

Update from the Roes

In February, Krista put on a Leader Day for her Bible Study leaders to encourage and equip them to be better shepherds in our Bible Study. We had a special speaker come from the Netherlands and had such a great time encouraging each other and learning



more about how God is using us to make an impact by encouraging women to engage with His Word.

So while Krista was preparing and leading her CBS Leader Day, Courtney was chairing this year's International Conference on Computing in Missions-Europe conference in the Netherlands. We had over 70 people from both missions and the professional world gathered to talk about the intersection of missions and technology. One of the participants from a country in Africa told Courtney that he had come hoping to improve some of his skills through the training workshops however he hadn't realized how much he needed to be re-energized by being with like-minded people in worship and prayer times. As we got on the train to return home, he said that he hadn't realized how he'd lost a little of the vision of WHY we do what we do, but now he was returning energized and engaged.

Straight from ICCM, Courtney flew to Barcelona to participate in leadership meetings for our mission. Our new president, Jon Burns, brings exceptional energy and vision to his position and he's casting a bold plan for Greater Europe Mission growing not

just in in size but in a way that is healthy and as a united group. Both church planting and multiplying disciples are a huge part in this and our ministry, eDOT, will continue to play strategic roles in them throughout Europe.

One and a half weeks later, Courtney led eDOT in this year's strategic planning session. As we talked together it became evident that there was some emotion and personal struggles within our group. It was so helpful to bring those out into the open where there is trust within the team. But we would appreciate your prayers that we would continue to work toward unity as a group especially as we continue to grow and bring more people onto the team. We were able to look to the future as well and identify some key issues that need to be solved so that we are prepared for what God has for us. Please continue to pray for the whole eDOT team as we move forward together.

Andrew Brunson Update from EPC Stated Clerk

This has been a quiet week in Andrew Brunson's situation. I spoke with his wife, Norine, for about an hour on Monday, and she told me that Andrew is holding up though she would not describe him as "doing well."

One tangible item I want to let you know about is that U.S. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson is scheduled to visit Ankara, the capitol of Turkey, on March 30. Norine has contacted Deputy Ambassador Phil Kosnett asking for a meeting with Tillerson. His response was that meeting with Norine was on Tillerson's "short list."

Please pray that this meeting gets on Tillerson's schedule while he is Turkey, and that Norine is able to travel safely to and from Ankara on March 29-30 (Ankara is almost 400 miles from Izmir, where Andrew is in prison).

Thank you for your continued prayers for Andrew's and Norine's continued safety, and ultimately for Andrew's release. We update our Andrew Brunson resource page,
