# Mission News



## Adger McKay July Update

I am writing from the land of temperatures in the 50's and rain...for now. After an amazing experience of being commissioned as a family into World Outreach in late June, we had a whopping two and a half days for the turnaround (including preaching on Sunday). We then left on Tuesday, June 28th and uniquely celebrated our 19th anniversary by flying to Frankfurt and starting our recon. mission. R & R has not been the name of the game...unless it stands for "Running & Ragged." During this time we have focused on finding schools for the boys, a local church for covering and good ministry locations for refugee ministry.



Here is what the Lord has done so far.... We have found, much to our joy that the local churches and individuals doing ministry with refugees are alike saying that they desperately need help and are excited about the possibilities that our mission offers. We were able to go this past Monday to a refugee home in Konstanz and spend some time playing games and visiting with refugees from Iraq, Syria, Pakistan and Afghanistan...there is a loneliness among many and we believe His love will fill that void. We believe we have found the School for Samuel and Ian, it is a Swiss International School that offers classes in 50/50 German and English and the boys get to be in the same School, which is important for the transition. While it does cost to attend, both boys spent the day on Monday in class for their respective grades and enjoyed it. Please pray that we will be able to get them in at the start of school in early September, there is much to be done to catch up (like a full year of French for Samuel!) Now the punchline...Imagine our joy upon discovery that the refugees we had seen in the area of the school are housed right across the street with 250 places for housing!!

We are now around 60% in terms of hard numbers for support for 2017 and the needed support for the remainder of 2016 is coming in steadily. Our outgoing, one-time expenses are around \$25,000 and we will need to buy a car, as well. Heartfelt thanks to those of you who have joined us with your love, prayers and financial investment. We were told that a number of organizations were beginning to back out from helping the refugees since the initial 'newness' is wearing off, so timing is critical. We covet your prayers for the next few weeks of travel, house sale.... His peace prevail, the McKays
