

I think this may have been a first: we cancelled the January 17 Service due to inclement weather. As elders we agreed it would be best to advise people to remain at home. I trust you all stayed warm and safe and enjoyed rich family time. Sadly that same weekend we learned that our dear sister Jane Ladner had lost her battle with cancer.

The memorial service was a tender time of celebrating the life of Jane and remembering the hope we have in Christ. We all will miss Jane greatly and keep her family in our prayers. May 2016 be a year of expectation and gospel transformation, whatever the Lord brings into our lives.

Session Highlights

- 1) Imani Melele Children's Choir The results from the congregational survey were review and discussed. Two thirds of the respondents did not support hosting this children's choir this summer. A motion was made by Luke Allsbrook that it is with sincere regrets that Providence Church will not be able to host the choir in July of 2016. After a second by Bob Dresdow, the motion passed unanimously.
- 2) Revised Elder Care (Shepherd) Groups Pastor Edward reviewed the new distribution of members into these groups. It was decided that inactive members would not be included in the new Elder Care Groups. All elders were encouraged to contact their "sheep" on a regular basis.
- 3) Church Security Review Phil Inglis recommended the following procedures to better secure the church:
- a) The opening/closing elder should remain in the back of the Sanctuary during the service to handle any emergency situations that arise.
- b) The back door leading to the parking lot from the Fellowship Hall should be locked during the worship service.
- c) Emergency procedures for fire, medical problems, intruders, etc. will be further developed and practiced.

- d) Every active elder should know the church address and have a cell phone available for 911 calls. The physical address of Providence Church is: 1400 Old Clyde Road, Clyde, NC 28731.
- 4) Ministry Focus for Active Elders Each elder will be in charge of the following ministries of the church in 2016:

Discipleship & Christian Education - Luke Allbrook

Worship Committee – Bob Dresdow Finance Committee – Bruce Kingshill Congregational Care – Phil Inglis Missions Committee - Curt Sevig Clerk of Session – LuAnn Davis

- 5) Ad hoc Committee on Partnership with HCA Session members discussed the need to expand and develop the partnership with Haywood Christian Academy. Bruce Kingshill will be the liaison between Providence and HCA. Three members from the church will also serve on the committee.
- 6) Luke Allsbrook made a motion to invite Alan Cheney to fill the position of youth and family director at \$13.00/hour for 8 hours each week. This is to start immediately with a 90-day trial period. Since this recommendation came from the Discipleship & Christian Education Committee, no second is needed. The motion passed unanimously.





We were blessed to have our whole family together for the Christmas holiday. Tim is a private client banker for Chase Bank in Tucson, Arizona. He attends a church plant in that city and is actively involved in ministry. Celeste lives only a few minutes away from us in Uganda. She teaches middle and high school math and science at Heritage International School in Kampala.




For more than two years, Bruce led the pastoral team at New City Church.

The goal was to see one of the three Ugandan men on that team ordained and installed as our new pastor. That dream became a reality as Pastor Rodgers was installed in November.

We look forward to his having a long and fruitful ministry. Rodgers also serves as the Uganda director of the African Center for Apologetics Research (www.acfar.org). The other members of the pastoral team are also heavily involved in ministry. Daniel looks forward to launching a church plant in an area south of town known as Seguku. Eric serves as registrar at Westminster Theological Seminary in Uganda.

New Ministry Focus

The biggest change for us on the field in recent months happened in October. Bruce stepped down as leader of the MTW Kampala team in order to form a new team, the East Africa Ministerial Training Team. This new team concentrates on establishing churches and equipping leaders in Uganda and the surrounding nations using both traditional and non-traditional approaches. The change has allowed us to focus on the areas that are of greatest interest to us while leaving to others such important ministries as community development and business coaching. Please pray that God will bless and "establish the work of our hands."



Looking Ahead

2016 looks to be another busy year with many exciting opportunities. Bruce teaches a seminary module in late January. The regular semester begins in February. Pam is scheduled to teach Advanced Reading , Women in Ministry, and Speech and Communication. Bruce's class lineup at WCIU includes Genesis and Exodus - Deuteronomy. At ABU he will have the Gospel of John class with the first year students along with two post-graduate courses: Genesis and John. We also anticipate the launch of a new church plant in the next few months. We very much appreciate your remembering us in your prayers.

Update from George & Cynthia

On January 12th I had a seizure that lasted 3-5 inutes. We had a friend come over who used to be an EMT and he took my blood pressure, which was fine and checked my heart rate which was normal. We contacted a doctor in the states who recommended that I get a cat scan.

I got a cat scan and was told that there was a shadow on the scan but they needed a MRI to further determine what it was. We were scheduled to leave for Thailand for our area conference the following Tuesday, so we scheduled an appointment with a neurologist at the Bangkok Hospital. The doctor had a MRI done on Friday the 22nd. The doctor determined that it is most likely a pocket of infection that had formed in my brain just behind the sinuses. I had had a sinus infection 2 weeks prior to the seizure.

For now, I am being told I will be in the Bangkok hospital for two weeks while they administer IV antibiotics. After 5-7 days of being on IV antibiotics they will do another cat scan to make sure the infection is shrinking.

I am having no pain and no more episodes of seizures. Cynthia is staying in hospital room with me and people from the conference are visiting regularly. Thanks for lifting us up to Father.

Matt and Laurie - January 2016 Update

Beginning to see the fruit - To see men and women who first came to us a few months ago with shoulders slumped, discouragement written on their faces now walk out our doors with a smile and skip in their step is a jump-up-and-down praise worthy moment.

I'm going to fill you in on what's going on with us that makes us so excited!

- I We now have about 18 weekly clients who meet either at our home office, at Beacon of Hope in Holland, MI, or via Skype because they live too far to meet. (We meet these last sort of men and women through the blog or through podcasting we have done.)
- I Most of these clients do not pay anything or pay what they can. Because our target audience is those in the margin, these men and women often do not have the money needed to pay. We depend on supporters like you to make up the difference. (Thank you! For December, we picked up our loss from the two months before.)
- I We are still meeting with pastors, teaching some church staff, teaching youth groups, building partnerships with a local Christian university, beginning to partner with our local church, Madison Square, and working on writing and blogging projects.
- I We average about 2-3 speaking/teaching times per month (some very small, some larger). We usually receive compensation for these speaking engagements, but also know the need to "get out name out there" with people to develop trust and rapport.
- I We officially have our 501(c)3 status with the state and federal government! It came in just in time, so all donations we received for 2015 (and after) are tax-deductible.
- I I, Laurie, am still writing for and podcasting with Our Daily Bread's Off the Page team. It is a delight to have conversations with other Millennials through this outlet, and it feels very worthwhile to reach out to many in my generation who are so lost.
- I We met with a Christian, local businessman a couple weeks ago, and we talked about how we can partner with him to reach more people. This connection seems like an absolute answer to prayer. (He has been working for years on reaching out to SSA Christians and non-Christians to see how we, as believers, can do a better job of reaching out.) His influence on Christian leaders in the area could be very helpful, and his excitement about what we re doing is encouraging.
- I I, Laurie, am going to the same training in January that Matt attended at Ashland Seminary this summer. I have been utilizing the tools he learned, but I will officially have my certificate in Formational Prayer after attending. I can't wait.
- I The greatest thrill for both of us is to do tag-team counseling/mentorship. God has gifted us similarly in many ways, but very differently in others. (I am a discerner/feeler/sensor, and he is a wise/cognitive/patient leader.) Allowing God to use our unique giftedness in ministry is a joy and act of worship.

As always, thank you for your prayer and financial support. It is an honor to do what we do, and without you, we couldn't do it!

Mideast Update

Yesterday, we were able to visit in the home of an Arab family who has been a long-time friend of Lisa. Their 19 year old son hasn't been able to pass his challenging high school exit exams, and unable to find work without a passing mark for the last year. He is discouraged and disillusioned without hope for his future. Our friend asked us to help her son. *Pray for us to constantly be able to give a message of hope!*

Recently, we had a Syrian refugee family come to the health clinic where Lisa works. The wife had tuberculosis and then a stroke after delivering her 7th child. The unprepared father was caring for all the children on his own while his wife was in the ICU 5 hours away. The newborn was losing weight and had sunken eyes and was only being fed a bottle 2-3 times a day by the oldest 10 year old daughter. We were able to give teaching about proper feeding amounts, provide formula and pray for this family. Thankfully--the newborn (now 3 months) is thriving. *Pray for us as we minister to people to lovingly demonstrate the love of Christ!*

This last year, we knew we would need to transition to home schooling. The Lord provided 4 different sets of short-term teachers to come and work with our kids this year in 2-3 month increments. Again in faith, we are asking our Father to provide a teacher for our three daughters as we need help for the Fall 2016. He has been so faithful to us so far...we know He isn't going to stop. **Pray for the Lord to provide a teacher(s) to enable our girls to learn well!** Lance &:Lisa
