

From the McKays June Report

[We had] a divine appointment by the Lord with some Afghans that we have known a while as we 'spontaneously' dropped in and discovered that they had just received their letter informing them that they would have to return to Kabul...it arrived the day of the truck blast there that killed at least 100. The official stance here is that it is safe to return them. We drove them to their lawyer to appeal.

In broken German he explained, 'Wir alles Tod'...'we are all dead' if we go back to Afghanistan. It was not a statement made with great drama, just a matter-of-fact analysis of what the father of five believed would happen. The pressure is intense here as the upcoming elections here are leading the government to push for more refugees to be sent home in order to keep the voters on the right on board. We believe one of our many roles is to keep seeing the individuals and their stories as that which matters deeply to the Lord... something the government is unable to do. We were able to pray for their family as they await the future.

Our young Syrian friend is coming over again tomorrow to eat with us. We look forward to these opportunities to share more about the truth and love of the Lord. This month has presented a unique challenge because of Ramadan... since the M.'s are unable to eat or drink anything during the daylight hours. We covet your prayers for the power of His love and Spirit to reveal the vast divide between His grace and the binding 'letter' of religiosity!

two classes. At the conclusion of the classes in July, we have our Cru national staff conference that occurs every 2 years. We are incredibly thankful for your many prayers and faithful partnership with us to get to serve students for Christ here at MSU, and get valuable training development. God is using you in our lives and the lives of college students!
