

While winter is still holding on here to a measure (with some snow this past week and some in the forecast for next week), we are enjoying the relationships and opportunities that the Lord has provided for us here in Germany. We had the privilege of taking one young friend with us to church...he was fascinated and very positive about the experience.

A couple of our Syrian friends have lately shared the challenges they face of trying to learn German and integrate...while their hearts are filled with concern for their families who remain behind, one of which is in a particular hotspot, Raqqa! Another of them is here alone, hoping his wife and child can join him...we see the pain in his eyes as we playfully interact with Samuel and Ian as a family. Many of the Afghanis we know are facing an uncertain future, as the government here has determined that it is safe to begin returning some of them to Afghanistan...yet their conversations with family and friends indicate otherwise, as violence remains the norm,...often left unreported by Western media.

Update on the Pallets

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Attached is our latest update. As most of you know, we are hoping to be able to return [overseas] soon. I am in the process of raising more support so that we can be fully funded and grow Cynthi@'s art classes by having the support for supplies, having a larger apartment so that she can grow her classes from 5 students to 10 students and so that we can feed them when they want to stay for a meal with us. We will also possibly have to travel to Hong Kong every three months for some follow-up MRI's for at least one year.

We have also put our health care deductible costs and our co-pays on our credit card as well as using most of the money from our emergency funds. This has either hit or is very close to the \$8,000 maximum per year already. We had our credit card clear at the end of 2016 but that has changed rapidly with the new year and the continuing cost of treatment including Chemo and MRI's.

We are thankful to so many who have already and continue to support us in various ways with places to live, a car, grocery money, and health care costs.

In spite of the costs and the aches and pains, and especially not being [overseas], God has greatly used this time. I have learned how to go to bed earlier, wake up earlier and have 2-3 hours of "quiet time" to read and meditate and pray. This time has become very valuable to me.

"Jack & Jill" Monthly Progress

Thank you for being patient in regards to J&J's situation. Due to the security precautions which we have in place, there is a 2 week time period between our interactions with J&J. I talked to Jack last night, and I want to report about what happened on Sunday, April 16th, and how we are moving forward.

In general, J&J are enduring the intense oversight of Jack's family as part of the original agreement (i.e. many questions, required times with them and at the Mosque...etc.). As a part of this, J&J are trying to undertake all of the family's requirements so that the open court case against Jack will be withdrawn.

On April 16th, both J&J were called into the "internal security" for interviews. During the meeting, both were separated, questioned about their relationship with the foreign "missi0n@ry" community, the house church network, specific missi0n@ries, and told that a "security clearance" required for jobs in Jordan would not be given to them. Basically, the authorities want them to suffer for not cooperating.

On the bright side, the family's passports are with them currently. At this point, we are investigating a means of how to use the purchased tickets to Brazil in the future. At this point, the greatest priority is having the court case closed. Closing this might open some better possibilities.

Employment

Jack has attempted to secure work, but the lack of a "security clearance" has stopped these efforts. Jill is still looking and has not received an offer so as to test whether she can get a "security clearance" or not. We are hoping an opportunity will open up for her to try soon.

Fight the Good Fight of Faith

It truly has been a whirlwind of activity these past couple months in the best way possible. In February we had our men's and women's retreats where we were hoping for weekends of worship and deepened fellowship...and we got way more than we hoped for. At both retreats, our eyes were opened to the reality of spiritual warfare happening in our midst. Historically, at these retreats, the Lord paves the way for students to start walking in the light with the Lord and with fellow brothers and sisters in open confession of sin. This year was no different...however, we left these retreats feeling both sobered by how much the enemy has been seemingly taking ground in our movement (i.e. strongholds of sin, disunity, not being very evangelistic), yet excited and hopeful for the ways the Lord took ground by setting captives free from sin and preparing us for battle. We left these retreats keenly aware of the spiritual battle we are fighting and are reminded of Paul's words in Ephesians 6:10-20 (armor of God) and his encouraging words to Timothy to "wage the good warfare" (1 Tim 1:18-19) and "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Tim 4:7). Because of all this, we are finishing out the rest of the year with a series entitled "Fight the Good Fight," where we are covering topics to prepare us for the spiritual battles we will face the rest of our lives: daily engagement in God's Word, personal and corporate prayer, surrendering to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, confession of all known sin, victory over sin through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, and living a life of faith. Would you please pray that the Lord prepares our students well for this summer? That we wouldn't just "survive" spiritually, but that we would take ground and Thrive in our walks with the Lord!

This past Spring Break, Matt got to help lead a trip of 24 students to Big Break LA again similar to last year. The whole point of this trip is to help train our students in evangelism and to give lift to the local Cru movement at CSU-Long Beach, and a couple other community colleges down there. As last year was a great success in training our students, this year was no different. Many students who came with us had never openly shared their faith with someone else, so it was definitely a step of faith! Over the course of the week our group (there 84 students total at BBLA), got to see 712 Spiritual Conversations, 245 Gospel Conversations, and 20 students indicated

decisions for Christ! We also got to connect the students we met with the local Cru staff and join their weekly meeting. What a joy to take part in the Kingdom of God advancing!
