

McKays Update

Apparently someone forgot to tell the weather here that it is Spring now, we have had snow four or five times in the last few days! We join you in the prayer that this will indeed be a season of hidden life springing forth in your lives and ours. Despite the reality that Germany has greatly slowed down the influx of refugees, we continue to meet new ones here in the Bodensee region. They share vastly different stories with the common thread of seeking hope and new beginnings.... both of which seem to be slow in coming.



I (Adger) was privileged to receive an invitation from a Syrian friend recently to come over to his apartment for a visit and some tea. Upon arriving, I realized that there were six other Syrian men with him... and it was for a meal (they had to wait for me to begin, ironically). It was a rare opportunity to be one of the 'boys' for a while and I was warmly included in all the festivities. As I visited, and they left the room one at a time to take their rug into the next room and pray, I prayed that the Lord of All would reveal Himself to them and keep giving us this access and wisdom to share His life-changing love. There is so much emptiness in the M.'s lives.

One Syrian man we know has been away from his wife and child (who remained in Syria) for three years. As the relationship began to break down (more) due to distance, he would share his complaints with me. This past week, he told me with a smile, "Ich bin verheiratet!" I am married... to a new wife. He was all smiles as the weight of that decision for him and for his (former) wife and son sunk in to me. His parents found the wife for him in Syria and are now looking for a way to get her here to Germany... I am not sure if they have ever met before. We covet your prayers.

While most of our work is with Afghans, Syrians and Iraqis, the Lord has opened up a new 'country' for us in the last few weeks, and we have prayed for this people to come into view.. We will share more in the next update.

We continue to meet with our Syrian believing couple and their son for Bible studies and to lay some ground work. She has recently met a woman and her son from Syria who just arrived 2 months ago to Germany to join her husband and other son. He now no longer wants to be married to her and has moved onto another relationship. Needless to say she is distraught. Our friend is hoping to connect with her and invite us all so we can also meet them.

Prayer/Praise:

- We have been granted new visas! Sandra for 3 years, the boys for 2... and I am waiting... but they took my money so that is a good sign!

- We are beginning to regularly meet with some Afghan teenagers to work on English
- Prayer for the Holy Spirit to guide us in inviting people to our weekly study/discussion group
- There is still a monthly shortfall in support of over \$1,000
- Sam and Ian seem to be doing well, despite eating constantly

Good News, Good Deeds

As we labor in sharing the gospel with college students, we care deeply about students growing in their love of God and in their ability to share the love of God with others. We often train students in evangelism and discipleship, and this spring break was no exception. Matt had the privilege of taking 20 Bobcats to Houston, TX to help in the recovery efforts from the devastating flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey. We learned that 80% of the homes hit by flooding did not have flood insurance, leaving many families reliant on soon-ending FEMA support. Cru decided to rally students from all over the nation to come for 4 consecutive weeks in joining in the rebuilding efforts. One of the houses we served was a 3 bdrm, 2 bath home occupied by a Alexis and her family of 7!

We tore out their moldy insulation and drywall, sprayed for mold, and installed insulation and drywall, but we weren't there just to get dirty. The students rallied for 5am morning devotionals in the word, and got to minister to Alexis and her family. After one day of work, we circled up with Alexis and her family to pray, and her eldest son, Cody, prayed: thanking God for sending us, and thanking God for the humility to receive help. **It was a privilege to serve alongside these Bobcats who used their Spring Break to serve others rather than use their break on themselves!** There was great bonding, prayer, and worship!

So much happens on these trips where we build relationships with students, have meaningful conversations, spur one another on in our love of Christ, and take the Good News of Jesus to others. We are thankful to have another opportunity like this to help lead a summer mission to East Asia this summer (May 25th-July 2nd).

Thank you for your prayers for this trip. Three men have signed up since our last prayer letter! **Of the 8 students going with us, 5 of them are Bobcats** Also, you will notice if you try to give us gifts on our Cru giving link that our picture and info has been taken down. That is to decrease our chances of getting denied a visa because we are missionaries, but the link still works for us. We are still \$3000 short in our support to cover the cost of our airfare, visas, and passports for this summer. Would you please pray that the Lord would provide for us financially for this summer mission? Thank you so much for your prayers and partnership in the gospel!
