Update from Albania - Steve Woodworth: World Outreach, EPC

Let me tell a quick story: Two days ago, on Easter Sunday, I was at a nearby lake after our Church service for a baptism. It was a beautiful day. The sun was out, the cold rain that had poured throughout the week before was finally gone, and after celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus, I was now watching a new brother and sister reenact the resurrection and enter into the Kingdom. Even more beautiful was the fact that the couple being baptized were a Turkish man (a former Muslim) and his wife from Thailand, who had heard and received the gospel through the testimony of a member of our church who is from Albania. What a picture of God's global church!

Of all the countries that ITEN (International Theological Education Network) partners with, I have spent the most time in the country of Albania where these conversions from Islam to Christianity are happening more and more. And yet, Albania remains a country whose population is still over 70% Muslim. As evidence of their country's religious identity, the photo is of the large mosque being built in the center of Tirana, Albania's capital. I have watched its construction for years now, and the next time I touch down in this beautiful country, Muslims from all over the Mediterranean and Europe will join with Muslim Albanians in daily prayer within its doors. The mosque serves as a constant reminder that Albania has endured decades of intrusion from outsiders with little space to dictate their own future. But Christianity is on the move, and the Christian leaders we are privileged to partner with in the country are ample evidence that Christ's Kingdom is spreading throughout this beautiful land.



In early April, I traveled north to Pennsylvania to spend time on the campus of Grove City College. While on campus, I taught an evening course on Global Christianity and spoke in their weekly chapel (pictured left). I also had the chance to meet with students planning to be missionaries after graduation as engineers, medical workers, and business leaders. My visit ended with a wonderful night of fellowship, introducing the people of Harmony, EPC to the ministry of ITEN.

IT'S *Time.*

If you have even stepped a toe into the LGBT+ conversation you know it can be fraught with pain, sacrifice, and anger.

Many of us don't want to go there as it will perhaps (and inevitably) offend someone to even say one word.

But we must. This conversation has been owned for too long by the shrillest, extreme voices in the church and out of the church. If we want to walk like Jesus and reap a harvest of souls primed to hear a different way, we must study and lean in with grace and truth.

Pastor Jeff Maness of Element Church in Cheyenne, Wyoming first faced his need for deeper introspection several years ago when a same-sex couple came to his church and asked questions about involvement in the church they now loved.

Initially he rattled off answers, but soon he realized more in-depth study was required. He read Preston Sprinkle's book *People to be Loved* and it—along with other resources—convicted his heart. Instead of repeating his beliefs, Jeff apologized and moved into genuine friendship with the same-sex couple.

Jeff did not change his theology, but his deepening theology changed him. *Am I going to argue people into daily surrender of their sexuality? Or am I going to love people like I want to be loved and trust God's sanctifying work in their life—saying only what needs to be said when the Holy Spirit prompts?*

The relationship with this couple still took work. The difficult, narrow road of grace and truth we are all called to walk is not called the “difficult, narrow road” for no reason! (Matt. 7:14, NLT) But God empowered and equipped Pastor Jeff to engage with gentleness and truth.

Two years later, one of Jeff's staff members, John Wilson, came to him with a secret that felt like it was burying him alive. “I'm gay,” he said. By this he meant, “My default attractions when I struggle with lust are toward men. But I am surrendering them daily to the Lordship of Christ like you are called to do with your version of broken sexuality.”

In our podcast interview with the two of them, Jeff reflected on this moment: “He didn't pull any punches... ‘I'm gay’ [John said.] Four years ago? I probably would have fired him on the spot just thinking that by him saying, ‘I'm gay’ he meant, ‘I'm pursuing gay sex or a same sex romantic relationship.’ But praise God, instead of assuming—because God had done so much work in my heart. I learned to actually ask questions”

serving them and the Church at large in their courage: When I preached the fourth Sunday in their series they did on the LGBT+ conversation about 14 people came to Christ! The following day, friend and author, Greg Coles, and I were able to help field questions from the congregation about how to engage this conversation with grace and truth *at Element*. After we left, Pastors Jeff and John were able to further support the global Church when we connected them to pastors wrestling with the same grace/truth walk either as leaders or as pastors wrestling with their own identities.

In the end, Jeff said this conversation and study didn't just make their congregation better conversationalists about all things LGBT+, it *has made them better Christians, period.*

“This has held a mirror up to our whole congregation—a mirror that needs to be held up to the big “C” Church,” Jeff said on the podcast. “Have we lost people? Yes, we have lost a few. ... [But] we are going to stand on what we believe is the truth, we are going to offer what we believe is the radical grace of Jesus, and we are going to present to everyone this gospel message [that] all of us are called to die. And if that means we have some death in the process ourselves? Then that is the cost for us in this . . . It's time. It's time for the Church to speak into this boldly.”

It is time. It is time, dear Church, to shred our fear and walk boldly, courageously, and lovingly like Jesus.
