

Reformed and Why it Matters

On the evening of Wednesday, July 10th, we'll have one of the sons of our congregation, Taylor Cook, lead us in a conversation about our distinct denominational theological



perspective. Every church has a lens through which they interpret Scripture. The Roman Catholic church views the Bible through (among other things) church tradition, and the job of interpretation has more or less been left to the "experts": priests, bishops and pope. Traditionally they kept the Bible out of the hands of the laity for fear that a plain reading of the Scripture (without a proper authoritative lens) would lead to manifold (and possibly false!) interpretations. This was the very mindset that so bothered the reformers (Luther, Calvin, Zwingli to mention a few) of the 16th century and that led to a movement, the Reformation, and specifically a biblical lens for theological interpretation of the Five Solas. This handful of defining elements of the Reformed faith that we as Presbyterians adhere to are: the Bible as the supreme authority in matters of faith, God's grace alone saves us (not our meritorious works), faith is a free gift and it alone reconciles us to God, Christ alone and no other Saviour brings us into right relationship with God, and finally God's glory (and not anything else!) is the goal of our lives. These Five Solas are the rubric around which we interpret the story of salvation history as recorded in the Bible. Further distinctions of reformed theology include an emphasis on God's sovereignty, TULIP, and covenant theology, the idea that there is an old covenant (as shown through Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, David) and the new covenant (as shown through Christ) and that God is pursuing us through relationship ultimately in Christ. We welcome Taylor and I encourage one and all to attend this informative and inspiring evening. A church supper is served at 6 pm.

Will meet on Monday, July 1st, at 5:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall.




Mission News



Update from the Roes

Community Bible Study



We are at the end of the Book or Romans and have had a great year unpacking God's truths. This year we deliberately created a teaching team to share in the messages from up front and we're also delighted by the real ownership that our discussion group leaders took in caring for and shepherding their classes.

You can also pray for Community Bible Study in Germany and Western Europe. We have 11 classes in Germany but desire to grow. Krista (along with a Swiss lady Kathy) have recently been asked to be the Interim National Directors for Germany as we look for new German leadership with a vision for what God can do. So we've been working toward new initiatives on translation projects (Genesis and Matthew studies) as well as better financial models that will sustain the work without being burdensome to the classes. Further we've really been challenged to think of the classes in Discipleship making terms rather than just learning stuff about the Bible. In other words how does it transform us and how do we share it, live it and replicate it. Pray for us, especially as we search for this new Director.

We would greatly appreciate your prayers and if you feel so led, your financial partnership and assistance:

- Alex's college expenses we're allowed by our mission to increase our funding needs by 10,000 USD toward Alex's college expenses. These tax deductible gifts would help with Christian private college tuition, books, room and board etc.
- We need to buy another used car. When we arrived on the field 12 and 1/2 years ago we bought a 2004, Ford Focus. It has served us well but now is on it's last "tires" and worth about 500 Euro. So any significant repairs are not worth the investment.
