

Summer Update from Steve Woodworth

Summer is in full-swing here which means the kids are out of school, the Georgia sun is baking us, and the garden is finally bursting with food. For our work with ITEN, summer is also the season of reflecting back over the year and preparing for the one to come. This year the summer season began in May with our annual ITEN leadership retreat where we spent a week pouring over each of our global sites to assess which goals we accomplished and which ones we need to focus on in the coming months. It is a time of prayer for our national partners and it is a time of celebration for the amazing things God has been doing around the world.

One of the outcomes of this retreat was a re-calibration of our roles within ITEN. After five years of service with ITEN, and the addition of new team members, Bruce Anderson and I are now able to focus more intentionally on specific areas of leadership within our growing team. In addition to my ongoing responsibility of assisting Bruce on the Executive Leadership Team, my focused area of specialization will be Strategic Partnerships and Leadership Development. This includes more regular contact with our key partners engaged in Theological Education both here in the States and throughout the world. In addition, I will be spending more individual time serving our national partners through professional and personal development along with supporting and promoting additional educational training opportunities.

Summer also means joining other pastors at our annual EPC General Assembly in addition to meeting with supporting churches, providing pulpit supply for fellow pastors, and speaking at the upcoming EPC Summer Jam. Read on for more information on each.

EPC General Assembly

One of the highlights of the year for our ITEN team is the opportunity to gather with pastors and leaders of our denomination at our annual General Assembly. The week-long conference allows us to meet with supporters, likeminded organizations, and some of our international partners as we share our work with fellow Presbyterians. In addition to regular meetings, I also had the opportunity this year to lead a special luncheon on the topic of "The Local Church & The Great Commission."

This year the EPC World Outreach is offering a unique alternative to traditional summer mission trips for youth. Instead of heading off to places like Haiti, the Bahamas, or Costa Rica, World Outreach has created an opportunity for EPC youth to stay here in the States and spend a week living, serving, and ministering among Muslims in Hamtramck, MI. This year, I'll serve as the evening teacher, bringing students through a study of the cost and rewards of being a disciple of Jesus Christ.
