

We all need to take extra care when we are "the last person out" to double check to make sure that all the doors are locked when we leave the church.


This will make our property safer but also safer for the next people who enter the church . Thank you.

eDOT's original mobile app, C2C Story App, is getting revised. Version 4 is about to be released allowing for easier navigation and use. We're finishing up testing and should



have it rolled out within the month. Currently, with 10 languages and 2 more in the works, this new version will allow us to add languages without having to do a new version of the app because you will now download "language packs". Get it free on the iOS Appstore and on Google Play.

Community Bible Study Deutschland

Last May, Krista took on the challenge to serve as the National Director for CBS Germany. To be frank, the ministry was in difficulty with a whole leadership team stepping down at the same time and years of misunderstandings and difficulties. So we're starting fresh with 12 existing classes, a new leadership team, new policies and procedures and fun new projects to develop. The goal is to get some healthy momentum and focus and to find and develop a new German to take over as National Leader.

This Winter Krista and her co-Director Kathy will be visiting all the classes, encouraging and giving them some equipping/training. We're working on 5 new translation projects as well as improving 18 old studies. We're partnering with German-language work in Switzerland and Austria. Krista created her first website ever (www.cbsdeutshland.org). - And no, she does not have the technology gene Courtney has:)- So far it's been a joy and a fun learning experience.

Prayer Requests:

GSM Films is a team that is a part of the group Courtney oversees. They're promoting a new movie called The Traveler. Please pray as they're already translating it into a multitude of languages with more requests coming in. It's a lot of work and they're already fully going into their next project.

Please pray for Alex's semester exams at University and for God's presence to be tangible to our family as we won't be together this holiday season.

Pray for a friend of Krista's that she is mentoring. She has deep life issues and needs to see the Lord at work. her name is Elaine.

Pray for our search for a National Director for Community Bible Study Germany and that like Samuel, God would give us eyes to see the hearts of people who might fill this role.

We are thankful for those who have given \$2000 toward our car need. We are looking for God's direction and timing on when to replace our car. We are trying to balance getting the last bit of life out of it vs. being proactive and not being broken down on the side of the road.

Please pray for the rollout of our C2C Story App version 4. Pray it goes smoothly and that many more will use this tool to share the Gospel around the world.

Will You Please Pray?

If you've followed the news in South America lately, you've seen Chile, Ecuador, and Bolivia in political uproar. Add to that the crisis in neighboring Venezuela, some think that Colombia is a tinderbox waiting to explode. That explosion may happen tomorrow during the national protest.

Protests are nothing new to our city. We regularly hear tear gas cannons from our apartment and are occasionally trying to blink the nasty stuff out of our eyes. But protests that are this well organized coupled with built-up, anti-government angst aren't as common.



Will a peaceful protest turn violent? Almost certainly. Will some of our famous Marxist groups try to escalate and leverage anti-government sentiments for their own purposes? Most likely. Will copycats target and ignite churches as they did in Chile? Will frustrations be aimed at foreigners as they were six years ago? Will the vulnerable in our city be made even more vulnerable? Will the day-long protest turn into weeks-long protests as they have in neighboring countries? We hope not, but that's why we're asking you to pray.

Lord-willing, tensions will subside in time for 500-600 people to flood our church on Saturday for our annual Thanksgiving community meal. As you pray, please also pray that community would form, that the gospel would resound clearly and sweetly, and that God's church would grow through this important outreach event.

An update on the unrest in Bogotá

We can't thank you enough for your prayers. Thursday started out peacefully, but by the afternoon violence, vandalism, looting, and fires ensued. Peaceful protestors beat pots and pans from their apartments or marching on the streets until nearly midnight. This cacerolazo is typical of other Latin American countries, but is a first for Colombia. My family used to do that on New Year's Eve to celebrate. Colombia does it to lament. Every clank and ding is a longing for reform, ultimately resonating for the sort of reform that only Jesus can bring about.

Yesterday was considerably less peaceful and more scary. Videos circulated of looting, stolen buses crashing through store fronts, police being knocked off their motorcycles and beaten with sticks and bricks. The citywide curfew made for an eery environment. Only Christmas morning is that silent in our neighborhood. But not everywhere. My phone was buzzing with scared church members whose neighborhoods were being attacked. People gathered at their gates with broomsticks and machetes to defend their neighborhoods. A groggy city wakes up to conspiracy theories about who was behind the citywide attacks. The only sure thing is that things are deteriorating.

We canceled our Thanksgiving outreach meal tonight. We'll worship, Lord-willing, on Sunday morning with a church full of fearful, exhausted congregants. Our mission families feel safe, but many we serve do not. Pray for the peace of Christ to rule in our hearts and overwhelm our city.
