"I have come to the point where I can now say that I am a sinner and that Jesus is my unique savior."

There's no reason, humanly speaking, that I should have heard those words come out of Nathaniel's mouth. He's in his early 30s and is the son of a former Colombian presidential cabinet member. He grew up all over the world and considered



himself an agnostic when we first met. His dad has been helping me navigate Colombian bureaucracy complicated enough to make me want to curl up into the fetal position. We've been working on this important church legal matter for five years with nothing to show for it. At least until now...

The paperwork we've been trying to secure has been a drama-filled disaster. Could it be that these past five years haven't been about protecting the church's property rights, but about God saving a secular family? Nathaniel visited our church looking for answers. He was surprised to learn that not only can Christians can be serious thinkers, but that the answers he sought after are found in a person, his "unique savior" Jesus. Now Nathaniel is eager to become a member of our church and these days his whole family attends nearly every week.

There's no reason we should know Nathaniel as a new brother in Christ except that God's plans are more beautiful than our plans. God's loves e like Nathaniel by making a yearend gift?

Gratefully, his people more than our paperwork.

We've been encouraged to see three more stories like this of new faith during these two difficult months. We're so thankful that our God is at work in difficulty. These are your stories because this is your ministry to the nations and the next generation.
