

So what is Lent? Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and an opportunity to reflect on your relationship with God. This means that it's a time for personal reflection that prepares people's hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter. The preparation for Easter through Lent is different from Advent's excitement, as we are remembering what Christ did for us on the Cross and examining our own hearts. Ash Wednesday was February 26 this year.

2 Corinthians 4:7, calls families to take a small moment each of the 40 days of Lent to: Listen, Be Still, Act, and Pray together. The given Lenten prayer is, "Jesus, walk beside me. Live in me. Help me find you today. Forgive me. Fill my life with everything you know I need, for that will always be enough. Amen."



Getting Out of Self for Personal Growth

Getting out of self for personal growth is a series of four workshops. Each class is designed to move us from worry, anxiety, and fear to a life of direction and clarity that will help us to grow and have better relationships with others. These workshops are sponsored by Providence EPC in Clyde. March 14: **Healthy Relationships verses Codependency:** This workshop will define codependency, how it hurts us and others, what we can do about it and how to have satisfying relationships.

April 11: **Self-Efficacy and How not to be a Victim:** This workshop teaches how self-efficacy and taking care of self, increases our ability to make and reach our life goals.

May 9: **Being Pro-active and the process of change:** this workshop explores how looking ahead helps us to be inner directed and gives understanding on how we change.

June 13: **Developing a Life Filled with Peace, Serenity and Love:** This workshop will pull key points from the previous workshops with additional knowledge to gain the peace and love we all seek.

Providence Library

Did you know that the apostle Paul liked to read? 2 Timothy 4:13 says, "When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books and above all the parchments."

If you have books you desire to donate, you may place your name on the inside front cover of any book you donate, so if we have two of the same book or if we ever need to purge books, we can ask you if you want the book returned to you. Delays, Detours and the Coronavirus

Delays: After a planned trip to Sierra Leone in early January fell through, I found myself with the opportunity to spend some time stateside to catch up with partners, churches and supporters who I see far less often than I would like. While my trip to Africa was canceled due to a number of reasons, the great news was that our national leaders were able to step up and lead the training in our absence. After 4 years of partnership, this was an incredibly exciting development as we seek to help our national partners become increasingly self-sufficient. We will be with them again after the summer.



Coronavirus: Due to the outbreak of the coronavirus, we had to cancel our upcoming trip to Vietnam. The city of Hanoi has already quarantined over 10,000 people, and our travels required us to pass through airports in China and South Korea which remain hotspots for the outbreak.

Detours: When one door closes, another opens! This cancelation of our Vietnam trip has now allowed me to travel instead to **Sudan** and **Ethiopia.** In Sudan I will be working with my ITEN colleague Mike Kuhn to provide faculty training to a local college. And we will both join Bruce Anderson in Ethiopia to meet with pastors and local leaders engaged in church planting among the Muslims.

Prayer Requests

- Turnaround time for these trips to Africa are very tight. Please pray that all the details of new visas, plane tickets, and itineraries are made smooth by our Father
- Please also pray that airlines and hotels are gracious in potential refunds (or vouchers) for our canceled trips
- Sudan remains very high on the persecuted church list. Please pray for our protection, and that Mike and I might bring much needed encouragement to our suffering brothers and sisters.
- Pray for wisdom and discernment as we engage with our partners in Ethiopia regarding the next steps of our ministry plan with these faithful ministry leaders.

Financial Update

Thank you to all of our new partners that have joined in 2020! In addition to the great number of faithful supporters who have been with us from the beginning, God has provided a handful of new individuals and churches who are joining the work of our family and the ministry of ITEN around the world. We are incredibly grateful.

Lizarazu update

I have been reading some really neat prayers and here is one I want to bless you with.

Forgive me Lord, for these Thy gifts, were taken quite for granted. My harvest could have been so full, if seeds of faith I'd planted.

Instead, I spent time "wishing" for the things that I had lost. When all the while you held for me, more blessings at no cost.

You waited oh so patiently, for me to just "let go", so there'd be room within my heart, to feel your blessings flow.

I never thought I'd say it Lord, but "thank you" for the thorn. It brought me to my knees in prayer, where Hope and Faith were born.





It was a wonderful year down here in Bolivia (except the month long civil war) and we could not have done it without you. We ended the year on a good note but quite tired and with a busy, busy sort of stress. It was with your help and the Grace of God that Eric made it over the mountain so many times without being in a serious accident. The cars have been working fine and there has been food on the table (even during the unrest – some folks and orphanages on the other side of the mountain ran out of food and water). In spite of the fact that peace has returned and we LOVE our new intern president. There is still a sense of terror in the air. Everyone seems to be on hold for the next big event. This fear looms in the air and everyone is holding their breaths ready for the next wave of road blocks and violence to hit. In a similar way, there seems to be some unease at camp too. A lack of peace among the staff and workers. It is not easy to put our finger on what is the cause of this dis-unity, but it lingers in the air and we ask for your prayers for camp as well as Bolivia. Eric and I wish to be agents of peace while here.

Speaking of peace. I caused such a ruckus the other day in the Nursery. Eric and I had a visitor come to church with us. Our visitor had a new born and a 3 year old. I took the 3 year old to her class to help her pass the time. The class was full of babies and their moms. I go in and I choose a stool to sit on so that I could be with the little girl until she felt comfortable in her new environment. Then all of the sudden two children started to scream, diving behind their mom's and turning their stools over and knocking their moms off. The moms all smiled quietly to themselves and smothered their chuckles. When the children continued to escalate. The moms quietly took their kids out. One, after another most of them left. Fortunately for me, I knew the old wives tales...I'll share it with you. It goes like this: If you don't behave, the old white witch will come and take you away. She will never return you to me or daddy or your house. She will take you away forever. (Stretch the story any way you wish...). Yep, I was the old white witch... and I just about cleaned out the nursery that Sunday. OUCH!!!

During 2020, we need your prayers for continued perseverance as well as productivity. Pray: That the Lord will shine through us so that every person we meet (even the taxi drivers) will feel God's presence. And that the Lord will take us by the hand because we cannot do it by ourselves.

Another funny story about a supporter who was down on a work team: This fellow got a bit of Montezuma's revenge when he was here. It is very common to get a sick stomach while visiting Bolivia. Anyway --When the Alaska team was here, this fellow, was not feeling very good. I made a pot of soup and left it on the stove so that he could have something lite to eat after he took his nap. The rest of us, ate and were sitting around visiting when he woke up. He grabbed a bowl and went to the pot of soup. He ladled up a big scoop and stood staring at it for a bit – not quite sure if he was willing to eat the soup. He stood transfixed, staring at the strange contents of the goopy mixture. That's when I looked up and yelled. NO! NOT THAT POT. THAT IS THE DOG FOOD SOUP. Don't worry, he didn't hesitate to go for the chicken noodle soup in the other pot.

We are putting the roof on the bathhouse this next week (rain permitting) as well as hosting children's camp. Lydia and Julia will volunteer at children's camp this year with the team of volunteers while Eric works on finishing the roof and other projects. Later this month Eric hopes to finish the First Aid Courses and take a group of campers on an Adventure Camp.

The widow's project is fully funded this year and we are super excited about that. The ladies are on a break until the rains slow down. They all have to walk to the church and it isn't good if they get all wet. I will keep you guys posted on all this as time rolls on.

Our plans are to continue working at camp, patching the roof, cutting grass, clearing forests. We have some monster trees that need cutting and we just had one of those monsters fall in a rain storm. It is going to be a big clean up. Camp continues to see about 6,000 to 7,000 campers a year. It is a busy place! And, there is never an end to all the jobs that arise.

Our kids are well. Benji is doing well in his courses at the community college in Alabama. Lydia graduated from high school and will spend 9 months in a tech school here in Bolivia. She will learn to cut and style hair, paint nails and work as a massage therapist. We will see what she will decide to do after these classes. She does have a scholarship to UAA, but wants to stay with us for a bit longer. Ellie has braces and may get glasses. She is finishing up 10th grade in her home-school materials. Julia is such a little lady and Andrew is growing up so fast. Andrew was recently baptized and super excited about it too.

It is good to call you friends because you have been so faithful to this project and directly to us. Thank you.

This is our ending prayer:

Dear God: Enlighten what is dark in us. Strengthen what is weak in us. Mend what is broken in us. Bind what is bruised in us. Heal what is sick in us. And lastly, Revive what peace and love has died in us.

Happy 2020,

We pray that the Lord would indeed grant His people perfect vision in 2020. The work here continues to provide many opportunities to learn to adjust as the refugee situation and climate keeps undergoing changes. As wars continue to rage in many of their homelands, the reality of being away from family and homeland continues to play a major role for our friends from Syria, Afghanistan, Iraq and Iran (we had some good interactions/discussions following the recent strife involving the US and Iran... most want the regime to fall).

In mid-December we visited one remote refugee multi-family home bringing gifts for the kids (although one older lady stared so longingly at

the gifts that she got one too!) and sharing some Christmas songs and some worship songs in Arabic, Farsi, and German. The songs were printed out in these languages so that that they could see what they were singing. This led to some good discussions. Not surprisingly, the M.'s particularly liked singing the part of a song in Arabic that declares that God is great! What a delight to share the joy of Christmas and its true meaning there in a challenging atmosphere.
