

Ministry Update

Being in ministries that have large online components, we have still been very busy and



actually have seen an increase in opportunities. For Courtney, there have been a lot of opportunities to share online resources and recommendations for how to continue doing ministry online when face-toface isn't an option. For Krista, she's been deep in getting several of the German CBS lessons translated and formatted for printing. Both of us are regulars to online meetings so Zoom and the like are familiar tools.

There have also been opportunities to minister to our neighbors. Please pray for them as many of them are small business owners in our town and have reduced demand or are shut down completely. We've had opportunities to encourage them and buy from them as we can.

Personal Update

Overall, we're doing well. Currently here in Germany, we have restrictions like:

You can only meet with one other person in public who is not family & you must still maintain 2 meters (about 6 feet) separation.

Grocery stores are open but have restrictions about how many people may be inside at any one time and of course, 2 meter separation at all times. Certain items have shelves empty but only for a day or two.

All non-essential businesses are closed. Restaurants are not

allowed to have people in spaces where there is seating and can only do take-out (many are closed but those that are doing take out **Our Town in the Black Forest** are passing food through windows). But as is good in German culture, our bakery is still open (but not getting many customers).

Going into nature for exercise is encouraged but you can only go with family members. The picture above is from an early morning hike above our town.

We have chosen to have everyone in our teams work from home to be a good witness to our German neighbors as we do care about stopping the spread of the virus. So Courtney has now setup an office space in Alex's old bedroom and Krista continues to use her setup in our "office" room. Alex's University decided to suspend all on-campus classes while he was still on Spring Break, so he is setup at Courtney's sister's house and finishing the semester online there.
