

#### **McKays February Update**

Hello to All and a happy 2021,

We hope that you all are seeing the Lord's face, faithfulness and hand in your lives. The rules here in Germany have made an impact on our ability to visit with our refugee friends, as the allowed number of visitors with another family was recently reduced to one... we persist nonetheless. Sam and Ian are also still schooling at home, creating an unenviable



competition for electronic devices between work and school. Mercifully, it looks like Sam will be allowed back into school fully next Monday.

A couple of stories in particular bring us hope and joy in this mission. An Afghan M. family we recently visited has a teenage son who was struggling with his reason for being and afraid that he could lose his parents due to some health issues in both. He had been laying awake thinking about life after death and we had the joy of sharing that God personally loves him and has a specific plan for his life. Please pray that we have another chance to visit and encourage J. soon!

Secondly, we joined some Iranians for tea and a visit and to see their 3-month-old daughter. The father had acquired some books of the Bible translated into his native language... Balochi not Farsi... tough to find. He had been reading Matthew and his face lit up with a huge smile as he said of Jesus, "what a wonderful man!" M. is searching for truth and needs to see the reality of who Jesus claimed to be and is. Please pray for salvation for him and his house!

We hope to be able to make it to the U.S. this summer... hope to see some of you then.

Thank you for your support and prayers... we cannot do this alone!

Like many of you, we've had a real cold snap in the last weeks with lots of snow. This was slightly complicated by the fact that the car we are using this year needed to



go to the mechanics for about a week and a half. Krista was coming up with "creative meals" in order to avoid having to walk to our local grocery store in the ice and snow. It was interesting:)

Germany's corona numbers are going down but our area continues its strict lockdown with all shops/stores still closed. Only the pharmacies and grocery stores are open. We are so grateful that we have good setups to be able to continue ministry online.

Even though much of the world is slowed, God is still on the move.... we have greater numbers joining the mission as people have more time to be evaluative and have the time to listen to God's prompting.

Greater numbers from around Germany are also being able to join the CBS groups who are meeting online. The barrier of not being physically near a group that meets has vanished. We are prayerful that once the new normal is established these people will be encouraged to start a group in their local.

This last Saturday 41 members of Community Bible Study Germany joined together online for a wonderful conference of encouragement, training, and unity around God and his Word. We received exhortation from a local German pastor who spoke on reading the Bible from the Jewish perspective. We spent time praying for one another, especially in these challenging times. We enjoyed Breakout sessions to hear from each other and explore how different classes found creative solutions to common issues.

Each class also had a chance to introduce themselves to tell what they are studying and their prayer requests. We were so encouraged to see the creative ways these classes have continued to meet online and care for one another. Thank you for your prayers for this wonderful day.
