Sunday, May 28 is Pentecost. Aside from Christmas and Easter, it is truly one of the most significant celebrations of the church. Some people even say that day is the "birth of the church". Maybe. If you exclude all the saints of Israel



beforehand. But even they "looked forward to the day of the coming of the Messiah". Of which The Feast of the First Fruits was a "foretaste". You see, exactly 50 days after Passover, the people of Israel were instructed to celebrate the coming of the Law (and when, later, in the Promised Land) the bringing in of the very first crops, in anticipation of the much larger harvest later in the summer and fall. Israel literally has a Mediterranean climate in which farmers could plant say, winter wheat in December (when the rains are typically plentiful up until March) and then harvest these in May. Pentecost is the Greek word used in the Septuagint (OT Greek translation) to describe this Torah-mandated feast. And so it was a shadow of the greater harvest to come. Israel exited Egypt, the land of their captivity the day after Passover (The Feast of Unleavened Bread), and 50 days later they gathered at the foot of Mount Sinai to receive the Law. Paul spills a considerable amount of ink on vellum scrolls to contrast the coming of the Law and its purpose and the coming of the Spirit. Now that we live in the day after Pentecost, the ancient prophecy of Jeremiah would come to pass in which people would not need to refer to the Law written: "not on tablets of stone but rather on tablets of human hearts". (Jeremiah 31:33 see also 2 Corinthians 3:3). So let us remember the words of Paul to be filled with the Spirit. And this Greek word for filling is not a one-and-done filling but rather a daily repetitive filling. As the song goes "Fill my cup, Lord, I lift it up Lord, come and quench this thirsting of my soul. Bread of heaven feed me til I want no more, fill my cup, fill my cup and make me whole".

Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023 Dear Family and Friends,

As we begin our observance of Holy Week, I wanted to get you up to speed on what's happening with the ministry here. I hope you'll find some fuel to stoke your prayer fires.



Last week our preaching team at New City Community Church started a new sermon series on a New Testament letter. Today, Robert, our pastoral intern, was scheduled to preach on "The God of All Comfort" from 2 Corinthians 1:3-11. It was a timely passage, but on account of what this young man haas suffered in the past few weeks, he was not ready to resume any preaching responsibilities. Less than three



weeks ago, Robert shared this very passage at the graveside service of his infant child, Four days later, his 29-year old wife, Grace, succumbed to the complications of a difficult childbirth. Robert is now left as the single parent of a two-year old daughter and is trying to pick up the pieces o his broken life. I have known Robert most of his life and couldn't help thinking of him as I expounded the passage in his absence this morning. Please pray that the "God of all comfort" will comfort Robert in this difficult time. And please pray for us and others who desire to comfort him with "the comfort that we ourselves have received from God." Please also remember the families in Nashville who have suffered similar terrible losses in the wake of the shooting at the Covenant Christian School. They too need an extra measure of comfort from the Father of mercies and God of all comfort along with the peace that passes understanding from the God of Peace.

As you are praying, please join us in giving thanks to God and petitioning

Him for these matters.

- We are grateful of the many opportunities God gives us to share His Word. Pam's conflict management course this semester has been the catalyst for many students to come to us for counsel. We are thankful to have seen some positive results come out of these sessions. *Please pray that the only wise God will give us wisdom as we point these dear student to appropriate portions of Scripture and-most importantly- to Jesus Himself.*

THE BACONS IN BRUSSELS APRIL 2023

OUR DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

We hope this update finds each of you well. Since we

have returned from the U.S. in early February, we have really hit the ground running, particularly with the church plant project as we wanted to send you all an update a bit earlier than our usual quarterly letter. Please read on for updates on the church plant and more!

In early February we began several weeks of Wednesday evening information sessions to share with others about Hope International Church Brussels (called Hope from here on out). Our desire behind these nights was to share first an overview of the who, what, why, and how of a new church in Brussels. Then sharing the mission, vision, and values, and finally the theological distinctives of Hope. These sessions were also a helpful gauge for how many people we might expect as Hope launched: would we be small enough to work in a home, or would we need another space? These weeks in February were very

heartening: from the joyful encouragement, interest, and dialogue we were having with people. It seemed additional confirmation of the felt need we had for a church plant in Brussels. (one of our Wednesday nights pictured to the right).



The month of

March has been a big one, we began Sunday worship at the start of the month and have just finished our first four-week series in Titus. We have had about 35 people each Sunday and almost every generation and continent represented. What a gift! We have continued our Wednesday night gatherings in the form of prayer and planing meetings with the plan to begin community groups later this spring.

Our church plan proposal has been approved by the International Presbyterian Church so we are now an official IPC church plant. And after several bumps in the road, it looks like we have a consistent place to

worship beginning after Easter! We have so much for which to celebrate and thank the Lord!

In Community Bible Study news, Rachel has been busy working with the Europe training team in developing materials to help equip leaders who shepherd other leaders in Bible studies and national ministry teams. Meetings with developing teams elsewhere in Europe are continuing and we have been very encouraged by more potential local leaders who want to see more people study God's Word. The CBS Europe annual conference is also coming up the weekend of April 21-22, so please pray for the hearts of all those who will be attending and involved. The theme this year is KNOW JESUS, KNOW HOPE.

Snap-Shots of Life Currently

Area Leadership and Development

Recently, Lance was able to lead a training for 38 field workers looking at ways to lead, develop and care in our ministry roles. One highlight was having a room filled with Chinese, Latino, Arab, and Western workers focused on ways to work

together to see God build His church here in the Middle East. Here are a few keywords we focused on: align, set direction, model, connect, and protect.

Refugee Health Clinic

Saliima is a Somali refugee. At the young age of 17, she was captured in the war and abused. She fled to Yemen and received UN Refugee status and was brought to our country. In the process, she became pregnant and unmarried which is illegal in our Islamic country so the officials placed Saliima and her newborn in the prison together for the last three months. She came to the clinic this week and began to recount her story as we treated her and her baby for malnourishment. She told us she would never fast in Ramadan because her sins were too great to ever be accepted by Allah. Since our clinic is on church property, we have an opportunity to pray with Muslim patients freely and we prayed with Saliima. She wept at the kindness of being cared for and a simple message of what Christ has done for all her shame. It made our hearts tender to the ways the gospel is living water to those who walk in places of darkness, shame, and fear.

Equipping Team

We currently have 20 adults part of our equipping team as they spend their first term learning Arabic and



culture. Recently, we were able to take turns praying and fasting for the Middle East and those around us during Ramadan. We are encouraged to see God leading these teammates to start or join teams in Lebanon, Jordan, Syria, West Bank, Bahrain, Sudan, and Egypt. We celebrated Orthodox Easter a week ago which is the tradition of the Middle East and joyfully remember what Christ has done for us!

We would appreciate prayers for Natalie who is recovering from Mono and trying to finish 10th grade well. Thanks for keeping up with us and praying for the Lord to move in the lives of those around us! Lance & Lisa

Lisa is also very busy with her home visit for lactation consulting. We are heading into the next few weeks, alive and feeling His eternal life drawing us into each person, plan and project. We hope that somehow God will use this in His rescue of all of us out of brokenness and to his awaiting banqueting table.

We are praying that you too will find yourself, as you are able, to live that eternal life we have from Christ in a way that enables you to be fully alive. And if you find yourself down, or in a slump, may you rest, and be still with Jesus; He will bring the sunshine back in and restore your joy, and in His time, enable you to reflect His Gospel to your neighborhood and beyond.
